Our current Career and Technical Education (CTE) facility, the Chesapeake Career Center, requires updating or replacement to meet the needs of students pursuing career and technical education. The Career Academies of Chesapeake represents a transformative vision for education in our district and region. Our goal is to provide students with a cutting-edge, state-of-the-art facility that not only equips them with the knowledge and skills needed to thrive in tomorrow's careers but also to align our programs with the needs of the local and regional workforce.

Our proposed model, the **Career Academies of Chesapeake**, will create a dynamic center that not only provides classrooms but also grants students access to state-of-the-art equipment, cutting-edge technology, and immersive, hands-on learning experiences that are directly transferable to the workforce.

However, to fully realize the potential of the Career Academies of Chesapeake, we need additional financial support. While we are grateful for the initial \$3 million through the budget amendment, the total scope of this visionary project demands further resources. Additional funding is essential in helping to make this dream a reality.

WORKFORCE READY

- We support incorporating career and technical education curriculum at the elementary school level and expanding opportunities for middle school curriculum focused on college and career readiness.
- We support high school students earning academic credit for participation in an internship, apprenticeship, mentorship, or other state-approved work-based learning opportunities.
- We support innovative models for schools to provide academic credit to students enrolled in career and technical education classes that prepare them to master industry skills measured through assessments, certifications, or licensures.
- We support establishing partnerships to strengthen the school-toworkforce pipeline in a variety of ways, including guaranteed employment opportunities with local businesses and learning opportunities shared between local community colleges and high schools.
- We support creative funding solutions to provide salary incentives for CTE practitioners who choose teaching as a viable career to ensure qualified instructors support our programs.





The Trade and Entrepreneurship academy provides significant and relevant learning in trade and industrial content areas, such as Auto Tech, Mechatronics, Construction, and Manufacturing, with an entrepreneurship focus to empower students to open and run their own businesses.

The Health and Medical academy prepares students for post-secondary education and the workforce in healthcare careers, including Dental Assistance, Pharmacy Tech, Radiology, and more.



The Maritime academy provides students access to state-of-the-art technology and simulation equipment designed to expose them to the industry and arm them with the knowledge, skills, and competence they need for this growing field. Courses include Precision Machinist, Welding, Diesel Equipment Technology, and more.



The Public Safety academy prepares students for experiences related to city public safety entities through work-based learning opportunities with the City of Chesapeake, including Firefighting, 911 Dispatch, and Emergency Medical Technician.



The Energy and Natural Resources academy prepares students for environmental sustainability work. Courses include Renewable Energy, Electricity, Sustainable and Renewable Technology, and more.



The Advanced Technology academy provides students with coursework focused on highly technical careers that promote exploration and innovation in information and technology, such as Cybersecurity, Modeling and Simulation, and Geospatial Technology.

SAFEGUARD FUNDING FOR K-12 PUBLIC EDUCATION

The allocation of resources to education not only fortified our schools but demonstrated a profound recognition of the pivotal role that education plays in the development and prosperity of our communities. Efforts to secure funding have not gone unnoticed and have had a tangible and positive impact on the lives of countless students, families, and educators across the state. However, it's crucial to acknowledge that education continues to be underfunded, and the impact of previous underfunding continues to impact school districts. From 2008 to 2012, we faced significant challenges in maintaining educational quality due to budget constraints, which continue to affect our schools.

Moreover, the COVID-19 pandemic presented unprecedented challenges, which caused learning loss for students nationwide. The need to bridge this gap, provide critical support, and continue delivering a high-quality education is more pressing than ever.

Furthermore, it's essential to recognize that the rising costs associated with becoming a licensed teacher have placed a significant burden on educators. These increased costs have a direct impact on teacher retention rates and make it increasingly challenging to attract and retain qualified and dedicated instructors in our schools.

Support Action to Address the Educator Shortage While Maintaining Standards of Excellence

CPS has a growing disparity between the number of positions essential for providing high-quality education and the funding allocated through the Standards of Quality model. Funding for these vital positions ensures our students continue to receive the education they deserve. The uncompromising reality is the full cost of a base salary, benefits, and compensation continues to increase for positions NOT funded by the state. Funding significantly reduced by the support position cap places the responsibility of salary, benefits, and compensation increases directly on the locality.

Oppose Action to Reduce Public School Funding

CPS opposes any legislation that would redirect funding away from public schools in the Commonwealth.

We request the General Assembly to prioritize and safeguard funding for all K-12 schools in our current economic climate. This crucial support is essential to ensure that our schools continue to provide quality education and support for all students across the state of Virginia.

SUPPORT SAFE SCHOOLS FOR ALL STUDENTS AND STAFF

We continue to be vigilant in our efforts to grow and strengthen our safety protocols. Those efforts include:

- Strengthening safety infrastructure in all schools
- · Providing routine training and safety audits for all facilities
- Including protections against cybersecurity threats
- · Increasing safety staff in elementary schools

Support Action to Fill Safety Positions with Highly Qualified Employees

To support these efforts, CPS supports legislation that provides funding for school safety efforts and identifies creative ways to assist in filling school safety and security positions. In addition, CPS requests the removal of the employer's Virginia Retirement System (VRS) contribution requirement (16.62%) for divisions that hire retirees to serve as School Security Officers. These employees do not pay the employee's VRS contribution requirement (5%), nor will they receive any additional VRS benefits from their additional years of service.

Support Action to Permit School Technology Grant Funds for Cybersecurity Measures

Current limitations on State Technology Grant Funds prevent the ability to strengthen safety measures to address cybersecurity threats. Safeguarding student and employee data, as well as operational systems, from digital threats is vital in our public schools.

Support Action to Address Mental Health Needs in Schools

The mental health and well-being of our students are integral components of their overall success. CPS supports legislation that increases mental health resources to schools, families, and communities to work collaboratively and address the growing mental health concerns affecting public schools.

Oppose Action to Legislate Local School Discipline

School discipline should be addressed at the local level and take into account the unique needs and circumstances of each school community. We respectfully oppose any legislation that seeks to dictate school discipline policies and urge the General Assembly to support local autonomy in this matter.
